
In accordance with Education Article, Section 5-104(d)(3) and State Government Article, Section 2-1246, Prince George's County is providing the following report regarding its property tax rates.

On Friday, May 29, 2020, the Prince George's County Council adopted the County's FY 2021 Annual Budget and Appropriation Ordinance. The ordinance includes an increase in the real and personal property tax rates above the amount allowed under the County's charter. In FY 2021, the County's real property tax rate is \$1.00 per \$100 of assessable value and includes \$0.04 dedicated to the local school board. The personal property tax rate is \$2.50 per \$100 of assessable value and includes \$0.10 dedicated to the local school board.

The FY 2021 budget appropriated \$42,032,900 in supplementary funding to the local school board. For the period July 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020, an accounting of the unaudited amount of revenue collected from the education supplemental tax is \$40,637,797.53.


